# 2024 Milestones

**The Zona Franca, a leading public figure in innovation and sustainability**

**The CZFB completed its 2020-2024 Strategic Plan in 2024 and has begun laying the foundations for 2025-2029. This is a new step in what has been achieved by an entity that has turned 108 years old, self-managed through the revenue from the companies established there and the profits generated by its real estate assets.**

**Its contribution to economic and social development, a public management model, is based on pillars such as the urban integration of District 4.0 and meeting the sustainability goals set by the United Nations and the European Union.**

**The consolidation of DFactory, which has become the leading international ecosystem for industry 4.0, or the promotion of innovative ideas in logistics 4.0 and 3D printing through its incubators are examples of CZFB's efficient work, and with growing international projection.**

## DISTRICT 4.0: INNOVATION IN PROGRESS

The start of the expansion of DFactory Barcelona, as an example of development dedicated to productive innovation that must permeate the entire Zona Franca de Barcelona industrial park, paves the way for District 4.0. This is a new boost to the institution's work from a local to a global setting, from improving urban integration and citizen use in the Zona Franca to the international projection of its various initiatives.

## COMMITTED TO BARCELONA

In 2024, the CZFB signed a protocol with the City of Barcelona that will facilitate the promotion of 1,878 affordable homes and 96,000 m<sup>2</sup> of facilities on its land in the districts of Sant Andreu and La Marina del Prat Vermell, contributing to solving the social issue of housing access. In line with its founding purpose of developing the economy and generating social welfare in its area, the Consorci was also authorized to purchase the Torre Tarragona to strengthen its real estate assets and sell the Media-TIC and Crea-TIC buildings to the municipality to consolidate a municipal services hub.

## AT THE FOREFRONT OF REINDUSTRIALIZATION

EV Motors and the Chinese company Chery manufactured the first vehicle models at the new Ebro Factory, one of the examples of active public-private collaboration at the CZFB to promote reindustrialization. This is a prime example of an electric vehicle production hub, which is complemented by notable sustainability projects such as the cold distribution network for productive activities—currently under construction—and the reclaimed water utilization project for industries.

## EFFICIENT ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEM

2024 has again demonstrated Zona Franca's contribution to accelerating emerging companies, a key element of the 21st-century economy, with new milestones from its 3D Incubator and Logistics 4.0 incubators. The Zona Franca incubation ecosystem has involved 160 focused on entrepreneurship, innovation, talent, and opportunity creation.

## INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP THAT TRANSCENDS BORDERS

Barcelona's international projection in the new economy is undoubtedly strategic in the performance of the Consorci de la Zona Franca, which actively promotes the dissemination of its work worldwide. This was demonstrated in 2024 by a significant increase in its active presence at numerous free trade zone forums and public debate platforms internationally. Events in 2025, such as the 26th edition of SIL Barcelona, the fifth edition of BNEW, and the fourth edition of BWAW (all under the auspices of and within the ZF signature, within the framework of the innovation commitment of DFactory Barcelona and the Logistics 4.0 Incubator and 3D Incubator), will strengthen its contribution to logistics, the new economy, and gender equality.

## THE EXAMPLE OF THE BARCELONA FREE ZONE

The Barcelona Free Zone was chosen by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) to launch a pilot project to certify free trade zones worldwide that guarantee commercial security in their sectors. The CZFB is working to become, by 2025, the world's first Free Zone to certify the highest standards of security and transparency in international trade.

Barcelona is back. It beats strongly as a city, generating opportunities for sustainability, innovation, and equity. Our city is committed to an open society and does not hesitate in contributing to responding to the major global challenges.

As a public agent of economic and social progress, the Consorci is transforming this area into a new generator district, which has become a reality, with DFactory Barcelona at its epicenter.

An economic district that combines technology, logistics, and new sustainable industries to offer young generations quality, and competitive and locally sourced employment.

The Zona Franca, with the Consorci weaving a multitude of public-private agreements, has become a large area of experimentation and urban innovation to move towards the decarbonization of our economy. We promote cleaner energies for industry and mobility and develop circular economy experiences. It is a district that has not hesitated to take an active and fundamental role as an area where scientific and technological advances of public interest materialize, following the sustainability path set by the 2030 Agenda.

The Zona Franca de Barcelona will play a significant role in the coming years. Here, a new centrality is being built, with vectors such as the housing developments of La Marina del Prat Vermell, the new 4.0 technology district of DFactory, and the Blue Economy of the port front. This area intends to drive progress for the country and the greater Barcelona metropolitan area.

Barcelona is back, and, as it could not be otherwise, so is its new Zona Franca. Together, we will work for a more livable, prosperous, and innovative city.

**We want DFactory to radiate across the entire industrial park, transforming the Zona Franca de Barcelona into a central District 4.0.**

Innovation is embedded in the DNA of the Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona (CZFB) and is always part of everything we do. This reason, combined with our exceptional ingredients, makes the Zona Franca de Barcelona a truly special location. We have a strategic geographic area next to the Port of Barcelona and Barcelona Airport, just 10 minutes by car from the city center, and we have key infrastructure for transporting goods.

On the other hand, there is the city of Barcelona itself. A historic capital for the Mediterranean region, acting as a bridge for the development of commercial relationships between three continents: Europe, Africa, and America. Barcelona is a city that welcomes, invites collaboration, unites efforts, and fosters innovation.

This is why, from the Zona Franca de Barcelona, we find ourselves in a strategic environment. We promote innovation, the new economy, and Industry 4.0, creating new opportunities inside and outside our borders. We have DFactory, which is already an internationally recognized industry 4.0 ecosystem promoting open innovation. It covers 17,000 square meters, hosts 35 companies, and is 85% occupied.

We must continue driving this new industry's progress and support these companies' growth. That's why we are already working on planning a second phase of DFactory, which will be built on adjacent land and cover 100,000 square meters.

This is the factory of a future that is already here. Where alliances are created between companies, challenges are launched, and projects are developed together. It is an open ecosystem where everything is very transparent and visible to everyone. Spectacular ideas become incredible projects, generating quality jobs. Because everything we do is centered around generating opportunities, improving economic progress, and enhancing the living conditions of citizens.

As part of our vision, from the CZFB, we want DFactory to radiate across the entire industrial park, transforming the Zona Franca de Barcelona into a central District 4.0 for the whole Metropolitan Region of Barcelona, and becoming a global reference. To attract major companies to our District 4.0, we clearly know that the market demands three key elements: talent that adapts to companies' changing needs, connectivity with the world, and a solid ecosystem with top-tier universities and technological centers.

These three ingredients are available in Barcelona, which is why the Zona Franca de Barcelona meets these conditions. We are not starting from scratch, as we have a more than 100-year history of economic activity in this area. We are now transforming it to return to our roots, which have always been closely linked to innovation. Currently, we are transforming our area of activity to meet the needs of a digital world, and therefore, we are investing in Industry 4.0.

At DFactory, we have examples of projects scouting locations across Europe and eventually settling in Barcelona. For example, a multinational company has set up its Digital Hub in Barcelona and has a robust project that will grow rapidly in the coming years. So, this is already happening. Here, large multinationals are mixing with smaller companies with highly innovative activities.

It's true that DFactory, from an architectural perspective, could be constructed anywhere in the world, but what happens inside is very hard to replicate. Not impossible, but very difficult. Barcelona has all these ingredients that, when combined, make it possible for us to drive this great District 4.0, which is already becoming a reference in our country and worldwide.

# The consistency in the SDGs: Permanent Action

## ALLIANCES, THE PATH OF SDG 17

Understanding the current climate emergency, the CZFB has joined the "Citizen Commitment for a More Sustainable Barcelona 2024-2034," promoted by the City of Barcelona. It agrees to be part of the Barcelona + Sustainable Network and to act together to face the city's challenges.

The Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona joined AEBALL to promote cooperation, innovation, and sustainability projects within its productive fabric, improving companies' competitiveness and efficiency.

The collaboration agreement specifies joint action lines in areas of mutual interest, such as service development and the creation of a collaboration ecosystem between the companies in both organizations.

The spirit of SDG 17 ("Partnerships for the Goals") is further demonstrated by the CZFB's renewed commitment to the European Diversity Charter, promoted by the European Union in collaboration with the Fundación Diversidad (CZFB was the first of the seven free zones to join this movement, signed by over 500 companies, institutions and bodies in Spain and part of the Consorci's strategic planning regarding ESG criteria).

## SDG 16: IMPROVEMENTS IN GOVERNANCE

2024 has once again demonstrated the CZFB's commitment to aspects such as the protocol for using obsolete assets and improving transparency and suitable governance measures. Corporate Social Responsibility in all its scope, with a Code of Good Practices and Conduct, with goals such as combating money laundering and financing terrorism. ## SUSTAINABILITY MANAGEMENT: FAITHFUL TO THE 2030 AGENDA

In a global context where governance actions for sustainability are essential for 21st century companies and institutions, the CZFB is aligned with the provisions of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development provisions. This has been the case throughout 2024.

It is a core part of our commitment to society, as highlighted by the Special Government Delegate in the Zona Franca de Barcelona, Pere Navarro, during the presentation of the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) and SDG Department: "The world does not have a plan B, and we must now actively work for the sustainability of the planet and of companies and the development of people's rights."

## AENOR CONFIRMS THE CERTIFICATION OF THE CZFB'S CSR AND SDG POLICY

For the third consecutive year, Spain's leading certification entity has recognized the Consorci de la ZF for its management of corporate responsibility and sustainability with an exceptional dual certification: the IQNet SR10:2015 Social Responsibility Management System and the Commitment to the SDGs of the 2030 Agenda.

Once again, the CZFB has confirmed its status as one of the only six Spanish companies to have received this double recognition. This distinction values the development driven by the institution in areas such as sustainable mobility, renewable energy, circular economy, and support for equality and talent acquisition.

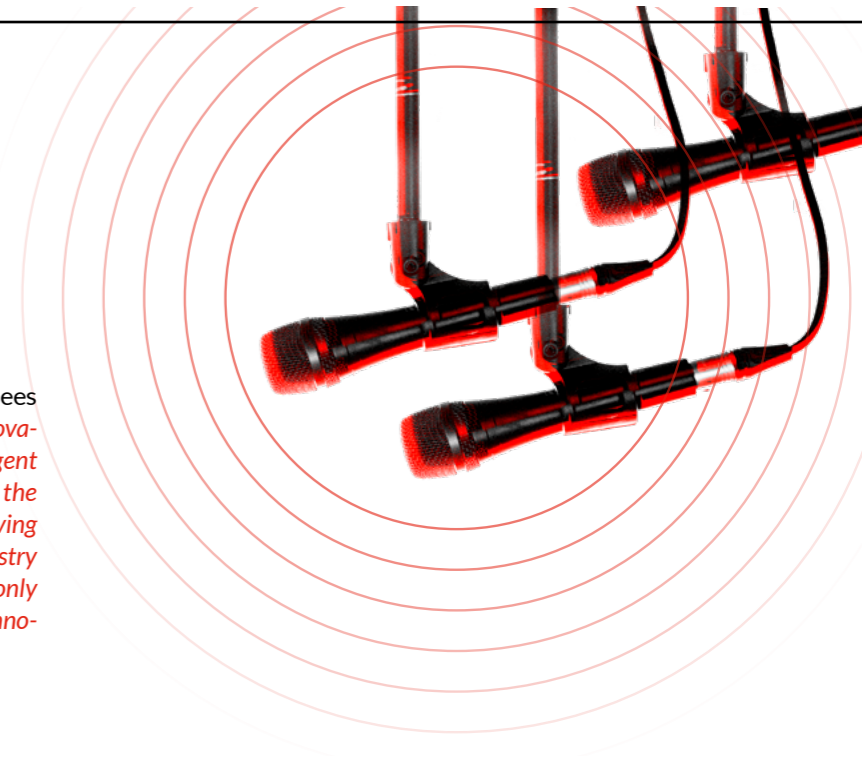
## Presentation in Madrid of the Business Model to Investors and Corporates

The CZFB participated in a business mission on the new economy in Madrid in March, attended by investors, institutional leaders, corporations, and startups from the Logistics 4.0 Incubator. During the event, Pere Navarro and Blanca Sorigué explained the institution's commitment to innovation and the industry's transformation.

The Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona gathered together representatives in Madrid from such as BCombinator, Enzo Ventures, Enisa, BStartup, Novartis, Glovo, Cabify, Cubic Fort, Airtrace, eYard, Red Colmena, the National Association of Soft Drink Manufacturers, and the Spanish Confederation of Young Entrepreneurs. Some startups from the CZFB's Logistics 4.0 Incubator, Spain's first high-tech incubator in Logistics 4.0, also participated.

**Pere Navarro** emphasized the push for innovation through two startup incubation projects, the 3D Incubator and the Logistics 4.0 Incubator, and highlighted the path towards Industry 4.0 by creating DFactory Barcelona. *"We are already planning," he noted, "the expansion of DFactory Barcelona with a second phase that will allow us to reach nearly 60,000 m<sup>2</sup>, positioning us as the European country with the largest Industry 4.0 project and one of the great global references."*

**Blanca Sorigué** closed the session by reminding attendees that *"the CZFB is fully aligned with sustainability and innovation, which are essential to progress. We are an active agent with more than 100 years of history, a driving force in the Barcelona metropolitan area, and we are constantly moving to generate opportunities for the development of the industry of the future."* She also added the importance of *"not only being agents of transformation but also catalysts for the innovation and growth of companies."*



# District 4.0: The **innovation** that transforms **industry**

District 4.0 is transforming the Zona Franca into a robust global industrial and technological ecosystem focused on innovation and Industry 4.0. The heart of this district is DFactory Barcelona, an open innovation ecosystem covering 17,000 m<sup>2</sup> that hosts companies and research centers dedicated to Industry 4.0. It has already begun its expansion project that will increase its surface area to nearly 60,000 m<sup>2</sup>.

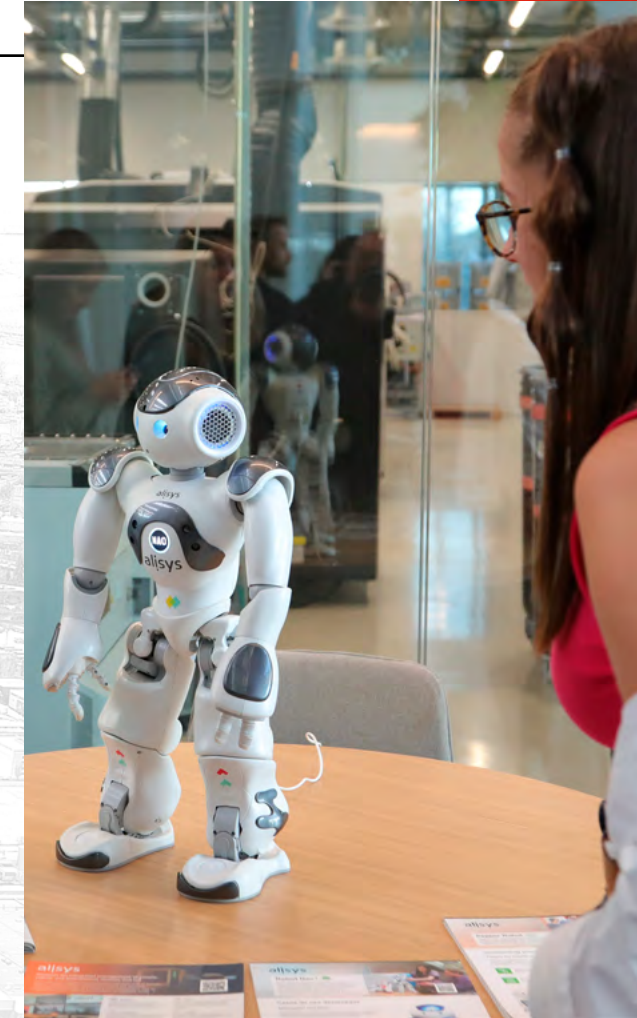

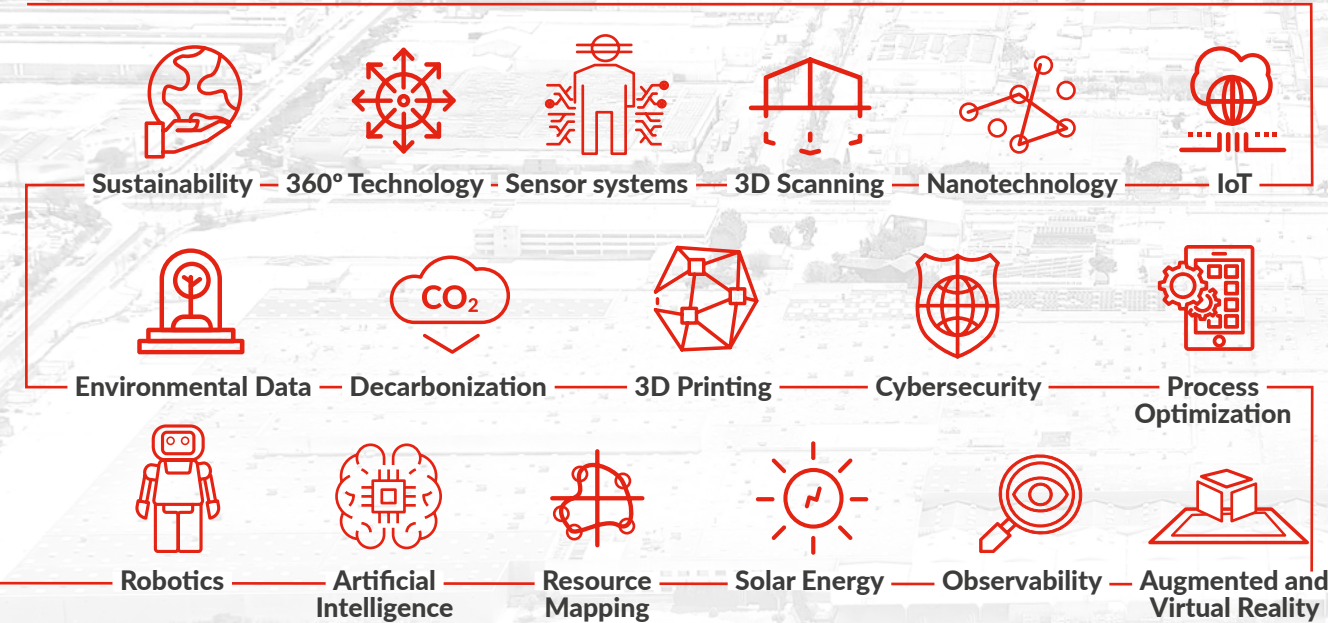

## New Boost to Innovation in District 4.0

### DFactory Barcelona Phase II

The second phase of DFactory will take advantage of the area adjacent to the initial headquarters to consolidate a proposal for innovation and sustainable development in the industrial sector. This concept, with international projection, will enhance aspects such as new manufacturing modes through technological hybridization, extending to the rest of the Zona Franca area. Its catalytic effect could reach 100 million euros in investment.

## ZF Incubates Startups

The CZFB will continue promoting the entrepreneurial ecosystem with the best initiatives and projects through its two high-tech incubators: the 3D Incubator, Europe's first 3D printing business incubator, and the Logistics 4.0 Incubator, the first in Spain dedicated to Industry 4.0 in the logistics sector.

# LOGISTICS 4.0 INCUBATOR

The project, led by CZFB with the support of the Incyde Foundation and European FEDER Funds, was launched in 2023 as an incubator for logistics startups (specializing in innovative solutions, services, and products). In 2024, CZFB held a call to welcome new startups while simultaneously working with the five best startups from SIL, reflecting our institution's support for innovation and digitalization.

The space includes 1,000 m<sup>2</sup> of coworking, meeting rooms, one-on-one spaces, offices, and a multipurpose room. It also provides group and individual mentorships on business models, technical/business activity, marketing, access to funding sources, networking activities and with corporations and investors, and more.

Over 160 projects incubated across both incubators.



### Added Value

This high-tech Logistics 4.0 Incubator provides opportunities to boost the productive fabric, increase economic impact, and develop greater digital competencies, both in skills and knowledge, to consolidate the logistics hub.

It is the **first incubator** in Spain dedicated to **Industry 4.0** within the **logistics sector** value chain.

We have already incubated **45 projects**, contributing to the transformation of business ideas into future companies that generate jobs.

## 3D INCUBATOR//

2024 confirmed the progressive growth of this CZFB initiative. The first European high-tech business incubator for 3D printing, created in 2019 and recognized by the Ministry of Finance as an example of management of European FEDER funds, was established by the Consorci de la Zona Franca and the Incyde Foundation of the Chambers of Commerce of Spain (as a pioneering example of the deployment of the Incyde incubation network). This exemplary sustainable innovation space includes a 1,000 m<sup>2</sup> networking area with all kinds of technological services and an experienced technical team to foster an ideal working environment for deploying testing, design, and post-processing, among other activities. It also offers support in areas such as finding funding sources and media outreach.

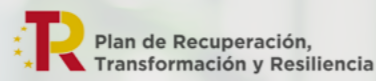

# Connected Mobility Laboratory in the Zona Franca de Barcelona



The PERTE Electric and Connected Vehicle (VEC) initiative brings together 24 projects focused on three key areas: Decarbonization, Connectivity, and Mobility. The flagship project, titled **"Industrial Innovation Ecosystem for the Manufacture of Electric and Connected Vehicles in Spain,"** has a total budget of €74 million and is developed as per **VEC-010000-2022-8**.

As part of the Connectivity area, the Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona (CZFB) is participating in one of the 24 primary projects: **"Test Environments for Connected Mobility"** (ETMC), with a total budget of €9.6 million.

This project is funded by the Ministry of Industry and Tourism (MINTUR) under the Next Generation EU funds. The project is led by CTAG, with the participation of companies such as Tradia (Cellnex), Idiada, Centro Zaragoza, Eurocybcar S.L., CZFB, Fivecomm, Tecnival, and Optare Solutions.

The CZFB, in collaboration with Tradia (Cellnex), is part of Work Package 5 (PT5): "Zona Franca Barcelona Laboratory," contributing to the development and validation of innovative solutions for connected mobility.

## PROJECT OBJECTIVES

### Define technological architecture

- Identify and design the necessary components to create an efficient V2X (Vehicle-to-Everything) communication system that adapts to the specifics of each environment.
- This may include communication networks, sensors, cameras, and other devices enabling vehicle and infrastructure interaction.

### Select use cases

- Identify concrete scenarios where connected mobility technologies can be applied, such as obstacle detection on the road, accident scenes, traffic light status, or wet road warnings.

### Develop testing methodologies

- Establish clear protocols to evaluate the performance of technological solutions in these scenarios.
- This includes defining how real-life situations will be simulated, what parameters will be measured, and how results will be documented.

### Main Results of the Project

- Design of the specific technological architecture for the Zona Franca laboratory.
- Testing methodology and protocols for future scenarios and services in real urban environments.
- Evaluation of the final results of Work Package 5.

### Innovative Component of the Project

This "Industrial Research" project aims to gain knowledge beyond the current state-of-the-art in various areas:

- Definition of future use cases for connected mobility in urban and logistics environments.
- Technological architecture for connectivity capable of recreating test environments similar to real-world situations.
- Development of testing methodologies and procedures that comprehensively address the components of connected mobility, testing both individual elements and the entire value chain.

## Final Goal

Conceptualize a medium and long-term testing space for electric and connected mobility components.

# An organization in constant evolution

Pere Navarro, Special Government Delegate, and Blanca Sorigué, General Director, have led the execution of the strategic plan designed until 2024, with a review planned for the 2025-2029 period, achieving nearly 100% compliance with the Strategic Projects Plan, in line with its guidelines, objectives, and pillars, as confirmed by the organization's board at the end of the fiscal year.

### Among the measures adopted in 2024, the following stand out:

- Development of the requirements mandated by ISO/IEC 27001:2022 (section 5.3 "Roles, responsibilities, and authorities within the organization") and its controls regarding "Roles and responsibilities" from "Annex A," as well as in the ENS based on the CCN-STIC-801 security guide "National Security Scheme," directly related to the Information Security Management System at CZFB.
- Improve communication to serve our customers, collaborators, suppliers, and citizens better. This communication is carried out in three languages: Catalan, Spanish, and English.
- All our purchases have been made sustainably and ecologically, depending on the type of product/service. This is reflected in a 51.49% reduction in paper consumption compared to the previous year (always recycled, sustainable, and eco-friendly paper).
- For products, we require that raw materials used come, as far as possible, from eco-friendly, sustainable, and/or recycled materials (and ensure recyclability afterward if they are not made from recycled and/or eco-friendly products).
- In terms of services, we have consolidated the internal services for canteens and events at the DFactory building into a single monthly service and centralized the orders for the IT Department.
- Several KPIs have been created to track the increasing sustainability of our purchases, and improvements are planned in areas that need them.
- We continue the Supplier Qualification process and reinforce the contracting system according to the LCSP (Public Sector Contracts Law).
- Launch of the Protocol for the Transfer of Goods, which regulates the transfer of movable assets or rights owned by the CZFB for use and promotes responsible use when these assets are considered for transfer.
- Revalidation of all certifications for the management systems of the various departments of the CZFB, which have been renewed, and in some cases expanded, in 2024:
  - UNE-EN ISO 9001:2015. Quality management systems
  - UNE-EN ISO 45001:2023. Occupational health and safety management systems
  - EN ISO/IEC 27001:2023. Information security, cybersecurity and privacy protection. Information security management systems.
  - Adherence to the European Regulation EMAS CE 1221/2009. Community Eco-Management and Audit Scheme.
  - UNEIQNet SR10. Social Responsibility Management System.
  - Sustainable strategy (SDGs) - AENOR.
  - Adhesion to the United Nations Global Compact
  - LEED GOLD. Sustainable building for the DFACTORY Barcelona building.
- WELL Gold Certification Obtained from Green Business Certification for DFactory Barcelona. This dynamic scoring system for buildings and communities helps identify, measure, and monitor the features of built spaces that impact the health and well-being of both workers and visitors to the building.

As Blanca Sorigué, General Director of Zona Franca Barcelona, summarized in the Edition: *"BWAW has spread messages across all sectors of activity and generations: there are great opportunities to advance gender equality, and we all must 'do our homework' quickly, constantly, and efficiently in a cross-cutting manner all sectors"*.

**CONCLUSIONS**

- Spain ranks fourth in the 2023 Gender Equality Index, but only 24% of Spanish companies have an Equality Plan.
- Women represent 40% of the global workforce, yet they still earn 17% less than men for the same work.
- Only 37% of positions in the audiovisual sector are held by women, with 75% related to makeup and hairstyling.
- In Spain, there are 5,300 judges and magistrates, of which 3,000 are women, but only 14 female magistrates are in the Supreme Court.
- In Industry 4.0, female employment is less than 25%—for every 2 million men, there are 700,000 women professionals. Only 22% of women work in AI.

**The Consell de la Dona ZF Committed to SDG 5**

The Consell de la Dona was born during a women's assembly in Zona Franca at the end of February 2020, where a manifesto was read. Months later (September 2020), this manifesto became the founding protocol, a declaration of intentions demonstrating a commitment to advancing gender equality and building alliances in line with the spirit of SDG 5 (gender equality) and the other goals in the 2030 Agenda. It started with five companies and reached 26 organizations in 2024, with AKZO NOBEL as its most recent addition.

Marta Angerri, member of the Executive Committee of the Barcelona Chamber of Commerce and president of ODEE (Women, Business, and Economy Observatory), participated in one of its meetings, presenting the February 2024 data on the presence of women on boards of directors and management committees in Catalonia, one of the key objectives of the Consell.

In addition to visits to SERTRAM and DFactory Barcelona, the Consell de la Dona continued organizing actions aimed at companies and institutions such as the Escola d'Igualtat ZF, in collaboration with the Observatori de la Dona at the Barcelona Chamber of Commerce, and the "Talent and Diversity" sessions with the Fundació por la Diversidad and the Centre for Women's Studies of Europe.

**Presence of Pere Navarro and Blanca Sorigué at Female Leadership Events**

The Valores Equipo Femenino Award and the First Meeting of Women from Prensa Ibérica were part of the various participations of the top representatives of the CZFB in this area.



Pere Navarro, Special Government Delegate, presented the Valores Equipo Femenino Award to the Spanish Women's Junior Handball Team for their victory at the World Championship and qualification for the Paris Olympic Games.

Blanca Sorigué, our General Director, participated in several events highlighting female leadership. This included the First Meeting of Women from Prensa Ibérica (which coincided with the fourth edition of the Women Sport Awards), the Women Bcn Award from ESADE, and the Global Women Summit (where she participated in the female leadership and talent panel). She also participated in the roundtable "Innovation and Industry 4.0 with a Gender Perspective" organized by WOMAN Magazine, and held at DFactory.

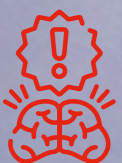

# Corporate Social Action

## Agreement with the AVAN Foundation to develop a reference center in the neurological field

The Special Government Delegate at the CZFB, Pere Navarro, and the President of the AVAN Private Foundation, Cristina Urriza, formalized the agreement at DFactory Barcelona to launch a reference center for neurology. The "Pequeño AVAN" space will offer a therapeutic and support space in Terrassa specifically for children, adolescents, and their families (the center is expected to serve 60 children per year).

Cristina Urriza, the foundation's president, highlighted that "the CZFB's financial collaboration will provide a suitable space in the city of Terrassa and its surrounding area to offer the necessary therapies to improve the daily lives of children and their families."



## XII Ciutat Solidària Recognition 2024

Once again, the radio station Onda Cero held the "Ciutat Solidària" Recognition (in its twelfth edition), sponsored by the Consorci, in support of work done by social organizations. The event, held at the Palau de la Música, demonstrated support for NGOs and non-profit social organizations working in solidarity, health, childhood, education, or social reintegration.

The first award was granted to Prohabitatge Somllar, which works to guarantee the right to housing for all citizens, especially for the most vulnerable. The honorable mentions were awarded to Secot (which promotes the business fabric—mainly entrepreneurs and SMEs—through senior and retired professionals' volunteering) and Mil y un Sueños for their work with children (ages 3 to 17) who suffer from severe illnesses and their families.



## Well-being in the working environment

The CZFB employees have participated in various training and well-being workshops, as well as social volunteering activities, in line with the Occupational Health and Safety Policy and Workplace Well-being. They adhere to the most demanding certifications, such as ISO 45001 for the Occupational Health and Safety Management System.

In addition, the Consorci has been recognized by the Work Accident Mutual Insurance (Mutua de accidentes de trabajo) under the "Cero es +" campaign as a company that has not registered any work-related accidents or professional illnesses in any of its workplaces over the past five years.

Our digital platform has continued supporting these activities in nutrition, physiotherapy, psychology, and finance.

### Workshops

- **Campaigns promoting physical exercise**, back to school workshop, physiotherapy sessions, "Rest Our Eyes" sessions, healthy eating, reading food product labels workshop, batch cooking technique, healthy office lunch purchases, skin cancer prevention session, setting healthy boundaries...
- **Informative talk on workplace violence** held by the Mossos d'Esquadra Regional Victim Support Group on violence in the workplace.
- **Initial Project on "Brain-Protected" Space**. In collaboration with the Spanish Association for Stroke Prevention (Asociación Española Freno al Ictus), the CZFB trained 30% of its workforce to equip them with the necessary knowledge to respond quickly in case of a stroke, creating a multiplying effect across all areas.



## Solidarity

### CZFB Volunteering for the "Gran Recapte" Campaign by the Food Bank

Volunteers from CZFB participated in a new edition of the "Gran Recapte" campaign by the Food Bank, continuing a corporate volunteering initiative started in 2022 to address food insecurity for those in need. This initiative aligns with SDGs 1 and 2 (fighting poverty and hunger), which is aligned with the Consorci.

### Utilization of Obsolete Goods

In December 2023, the CZFB approved a protocol for utilizing obsolete goods. Numerous computer equipment was donated in the area of activity in 2024, including cases such as:

- The Mariano Foundation's Shared Schooling Unit (UEC) supports students aged 14 to 16 facing learning difficulties, school adaptation problems, absenteeism, or school rejection.
- The Civic Association La Nau fights poverty and social exclusion by providing support to individuals and families facing economic, labor, or social difficulties.

Thanks to the accessibility agreement signed by the CZFB, Mercabarna, and Suara Cooperativa, employees of all companies located in the industrial area have access to the Somriures childcare center.

The Fidem Awards (celebrating their 27th edition at the Cosmocaixa in Barcelona), sponsored by the Consorci, recognized the business efforts of eight women (under the theme "The Sea That Unites Us").

## Pere Navarro, CZFB Representative at "Corremos por la ELA" and the Presentation of the Compromiso Metropolitano Awards

As part of its numerous Corporate Social Responsibility actions, the CZFB collaborated with the "Corremos por la ELA" race organized by AmicsHMar. The Special Government Delegate, Pere Navarro, joined this solidarity initiative to raise funds for research into this incurable disease.

### Forma't al Port

Another standout initiative of the CZFB is collaborating with the Port Authority of Barcelona and the European Short Sea Shipping School to train new professionals in the logistics and maritime sectors.

### FP Metropolis Lab Scholarship Program - 6th edition

A group of students from the Institut de FP El Prat presented the project "La Zona Franca, més accessible i coneguda socialment" during the sixth edition of this initiative.



### Solidarity Support for the "Emppersona Segunda Oportunidad" Program

The CZFB attended the dinner celebrating 50 years of PIMC, offering solidarity support to the program.

### Pere Tarrés Solidarity Dinner

The CZFB once again collaborated in this major solidarity event to promote the well-being of young people at risk of exclusion (the 2024 edition focused mainly on mental health).

Navarro also participated in the 2nd edition of the Compromiso Metropolitano Awards ceremony, where he presented 4DHealth Center with the Strategic Alliances Award in recognition of its "commitment to cooperation between different stakeholders."

The projects or environmental improvements driven by the CZFB, such as energy consumption and waste generation, are part of the institution's ongoing activity to contribute to sustainable development, which aligns with its Environmental Good Practices Guide and Environmental Policy.

## Waste Management

A key initiative in this regard is the CZFB RECICLA campaign, designed to raise awareness among workers and users about the importance of separating waste for recycling (with various tips and a consultation channel). Goal: To increase the percentage of selectively collected waste to 60% by 2026 (data collected until October 2024 shows that 36% of the waste generated has been adequately sorted)

## Conferences and visits

The Consorci participated in April in the seventh Debate and Experiences Day for a Circular and Competitive Economy, held at DFactory Barcelona. Pere Navarro, the Special Government Delegate, inaugurated this initiative, which concluded with attendees visiting the Industry 4.0 HUB at DFactory. The event hosted proposals such as the "Implementation Agenda for a Circular Amsterdam 2023-2026" lecture and experience sessions on water management, waste, energy efficiency, innovation, and sustainability.



In November, a guided tour of the Ecoenergies facilities in Zona Franca was held related to employee involvement in the EMAS certification, which included participation in the "EMAS Let's Play" competition.



## Sustainability Projects and Environmental Improvements

In 2024, the Consorci continued to promote several environmentally-focused projects to reduce its impact on the environment and improve its sustainable performance, with actions such as the following:

- At the headquarters, several actions have been taken to improve energy efficiency, such as improving the south-facing façade (thermal envelope), replacing lighting with LED lights, installing sensors, replacing the air conditioning units, and connecting to the Ecoenergies network.



- Energy efficiency measures have also been implemented at the BP building, including renovating the curtain wall façade and refurbishing the lighting installation.
- The CZFB facilities hosted a pilot test for smart gardening sensors (Fliwer technology) based on controlling vital plant parameters (light, temperature, humidity, water, and fertilizer dosage).
- Solar films have been installed on windows in the DFactory building to minimize the impact of solar energy on the building's interior. Façade improvements were carried out at the BP building, enhancing energy efficiency.
- To increase the percentage of green energy consumed, the Headquarters, DFactory, MediaTIC, Nexus I, Nexus II, BP, Dolors Aleu, Zona Franca Customs, and the industrial park's common areas have switched to an electricity supplier offering higher percentages of renewable energy.

Creation of the ZF Sustainability Club

The increased participation of CZFB companies in the Sustainability Observatory created in 2023 enhances their achievement of goals in collecting ESG/RSC indicators and impacts, following internationally recognized standards, and providing aggregated KPIs.

At the end of 2024, the ZF Sustainability Club was formalized to streamline the process for companies to input data into the Sustainability Observatory indicators, encourage participation, and foster collaboration among companies and their sustainability professionals. In this first meeting, Akzo Nobel and PRECERO were recognized as the most proactive companies in contributing data to the Observatory, earning the title 2024 First Sustainability Early Adopter at the Sustainability Observatory.

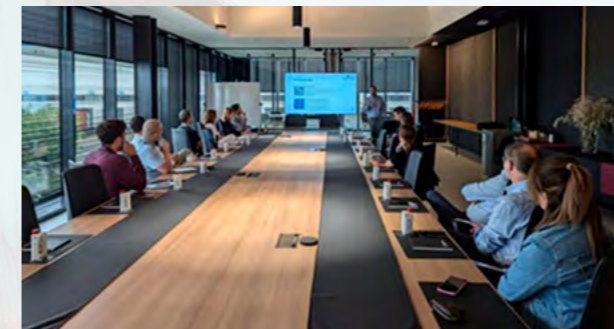


IMPROVING SUSTAINABILITY IS A CONSTANT AT ZF

Agreement with AEBALL

The CZFB has joined AEBALL to promote cooperation, innovation, and sustainability projects in its productive fabric, aiming to improve companies' competitiveness and efficiency. As a result, a strategic alliance has been created to enhance the business fabric of the Zona Franca industrial park and its Zona Franca Customs.

Participation in the Regional Water Table: How to Improve Water Resources During Drought



The CZFB participated in several meetings of this project (created by the Generalitat in 2023), contributing up to 70 proposals, including one about the need to have regenerated water available in the industrial park to address water needs during droughts.

The CZFB took part in this meeting with representatives from Agua es Vida, the Barcelona Chamber of Commerce, Comunidad de Usuarios de Aguas del Delta del Llobregat, CONFAVAC (Catalan Federation of Neighborhood Associations), Baix Llobregat Regional Council, Vallès Oriental Regional Council, Barcelona Provincial Council, Fundació Catalana del Esplai, Barcelona Hotels Guild, Catalan Sports Cluster (INDESCAT), Mercabarna, Catalonia's Ornamental Flower and Plant Market, the Port of Barcelona, Third Sector Table, Union General de Trabajadores (UGT Cataluña), Union of Sports Federations, and Union of Farmers of Catalonia.

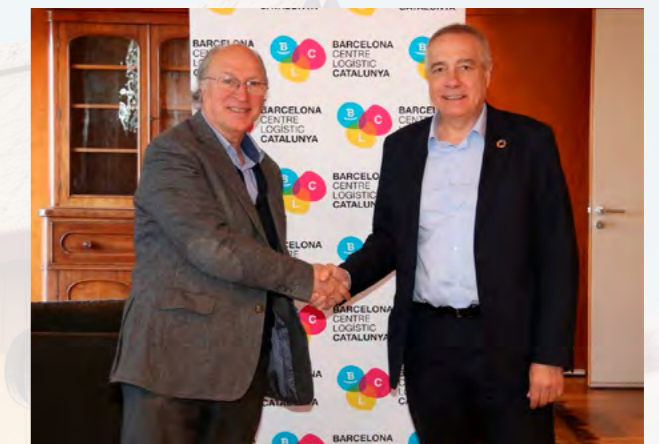

- The 2024 edition marked a historic milestone in innovation. The largest number of startups to date, 120, participated in the event, including 30 from the Logistics 4.0 Incubator. These startups participated in various networking and business activities, including the Startup Meeting Area, pitch sessions at SIL International Knowledge, and the Logistics 4.0 Incubator booth.
- SIL 2024 brought together 600 presidents, CEOs, and professionals from leading companies and institutions in the sector in the gardens of the Hotel Torre Melina in Barcelona, on the occasion of the celebration of La Nit de la Logística, the Startup Meeting Area, the pitch sessions at SIL International Knowledge, and the Logistics 4.0 Incubator stand.



### SIL 2024 Milestones

- The 14th Barometer of the SIL 2024 Logistics Circle shared key data such as:

### Alliances for Logistics

The event will take place from June 5 to 7, 2024, in Hall 8 of the Montjuïc-Plaça Espanya venue of Fira de Barcelona.

# BNEW, the global new economy event



The fifth edition of Barcelona New Economy Week (BNEW) has confirmed Barcelona's status as the global capital of the new economy. An exceptional event was hosted at DFactory Barcelona, a forum for discussing the key drivers, challenges, and advancements of the 21st-century economy.

BNEW 2024 has thus reaffirmed itself as the leading event of the new economy and a key platform for driving economic development and networking, bringing together more than 12,700 professionals (supported by its interactive web platform, which enhances the international and global reach of the event). Its innovative format continues to evolve, serving as a dynamic stage for information exchange, meetings, and debates. New verticals (such as Aviation) and themes are introduced at each edition.

## Socioeconomic challenges of companies, up for debate

The BNEW sessions offered engaging discussions such as "Innovation Districts, Drivers of Transformation," which focused on how Innovation Districts are acting as engines of regional, economic, and social transformation and highlighted success stories like 22@Barcelona and the District 4.0 of the Zona Franca Barcelona.

In this context, the CZFB explained that it is working to become "the District 4.0 of the Metropolitan Region of Barcelona," aiming to position itself as a global benchmark for the digital transformation of industry.

The **2nd BNEW New Economy Observatory** once again revealed insightful data on the relationship between companies and startups with the new economy. With 675 participants (64% companies and 36% startups), the data showed that 56.3% of companies plan to invest more than €100,000 next year in AI, Big Data, Blockchain, or other technologies. Furthermore, 22.7% stated they would invest over €1,000,000, and 79% of startups reported that they "are collaborating or are in the process of collaborating with large companies and/or multinationals."

## XXVII Congress of Free Zones of Ibero-America: Barcelona, a benchmark in the sector

The Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona (CZFB) participated in the 27th edition of the Congress of Free Zones of Ibero-America, organized by the Association of Free Zones of the Americas (AZFA) and held in Curaçao from November 13 to 15. Pere Navarro, the CZFB's Special Government Delegate, and Blanca Sorigué, its General Director, represented the institution at the sector's largest gathering in Ibero-America, where more than 800 free zones host over 11,000 companies.

Blanca Sorigué was re-elected as a board member of the AZFA, which will continue to be chaired by Claudia Pellerano. She also participated in the opening ceremony of the congress as Vice President of the World Free Zones Organization (WFZO).

In turn, Pere Navarro participated in the session titled "Incubators and Venture Studios: Catalysts for the Success of Free Zones," where he emphasized that: "Barcelona brings together several key ingredients: it is an engine of economic development that drives innovation and collaboration; it is an educational hub with top-tier schools and a talent magnet for attracting and developing specialized professionals; and it boasts a strategic location that connects it to the world, serving as a bridge between continents and diverse markets."



## OECD-CZFB Pilot Project to Certify Free Zones with the Highest Standards of Security and Transparency

The Special Government Delegate at the CZFB, Pere Navarro, and the General Director, Blanca Sorigué, met with representatives from the OECD, the European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO), and the TIC Council (Association of Certification Companies) to officially launch the pilot project, which selected Barcelona Free Zone as the site for developing the technical component of a new international certification. This certification aims to highlight the highest global security and transparency standards in international trade.

The meeting, held at DFactory Barcelona, marked a significant milestone. As Pere Navarro emphasized: "This agreement guarantees the identification of companies that comply with international standards of transparency, oversight, and regulation, which will allow us to move forward in economic and social progress." Blanca Sorigué added: "We are not only advancing toward becoming the first Free Zone in the world to obtain this certification, but we are also helping to define the model for others to follow."



## MedaWeek24

At the MedaWeek24 inaugural event, Pere Navarro highlighted CZFB's ongoing efforts to drive economic and social progress and to improve people's quality of life. He noted: "MedaWeek is an opportunity to promote the economic progress of the Mediterranean region."

Blanca Sorigué participated in the "Now&New" session, presenting the progress of the second phase of DFactory Barcelona, and later joined a roundtable discussion on the role of Mediterranean cities in fostering industry and innovation alongside Marisol Lage (DIBA) and David Giménez.



## The CZFB at the World Free Zones Congress

The Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona (CZFB) played a prominent role in the 10th edition of the World Free Zones Congress, organized by the World Free Zones Organization (WFZO) from September 23 to 25 in Dubai. Pere Navarro, Special Government Delegate at the CZFB, and Blanca Sorigué, General Director of the CZFB, presented the institution's successful model during the event.

The congress brought together 2,000 attendees from 160 countries and featured some of the world's most prominent free zones. Thirty-five speakers addressed the key challenges global free zones face, especially in this era of transformation driven by new technologies and their increasingly important role in promoting more sustainable, environmentally conscious models.

Blanca Sorigué, re-elected as Vice President of the WFZO, delivered the closing remarks of the congress, further highlighting the Barcelona Free Zone's international importance and leadership. "The WFZO World Congress has provided the sector with a global platform while also challenging us to prove that free zones are becoming more sustainable and are playing a key role in regional economic development through job creation," Sorigué stated.

Pere Navarro also reflected positively on CZFB's participation: "Over three days, all global free zones shared the challenges we face—but more importantly—we shared possible solutions to address them confidently." He added: "We're incredibly proud to see that the Barcelona Free Zone is considered a global benchmark in our sector, mainly because we don't offer tax incentives, which are the main attraction in most other free zones. That's why we've had to reinvent ourselves, supporting innovation, sustainability, the SDGs, Industry 4.0, and the new economy. The result is a successful model admired across the sector."



The Special Government Delegate also participated in FITAC 2024, one of Latin America's most prominent logistics and international trade congresses, held December 2-4 at the Puerta de Oro Convention Center in Barranquilla, Colombia.



Navarro delivered a keynote presentation on: "The Barcelona Free Zone and its Commitment to Digitalization and Global Sustainability". Navarro also joined a panel titled: "Free Zones and Their Role in Reconfiguring Global Value Chains," alongside Juan Pablo Rivera Cabal, President of Grupo Zona Franca de Bogotá, Manuel Fernando Martínez Álvarez, Special Government Delegate at the Tenerife Free Zone, Gabriel Corujo Bolaños, Special Government Delegate at the Gran Canaria Free Zone.

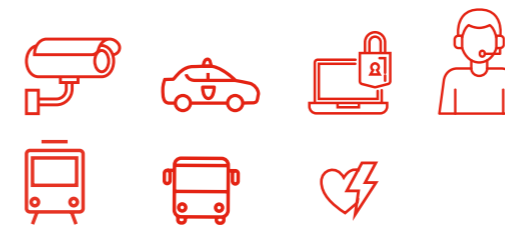

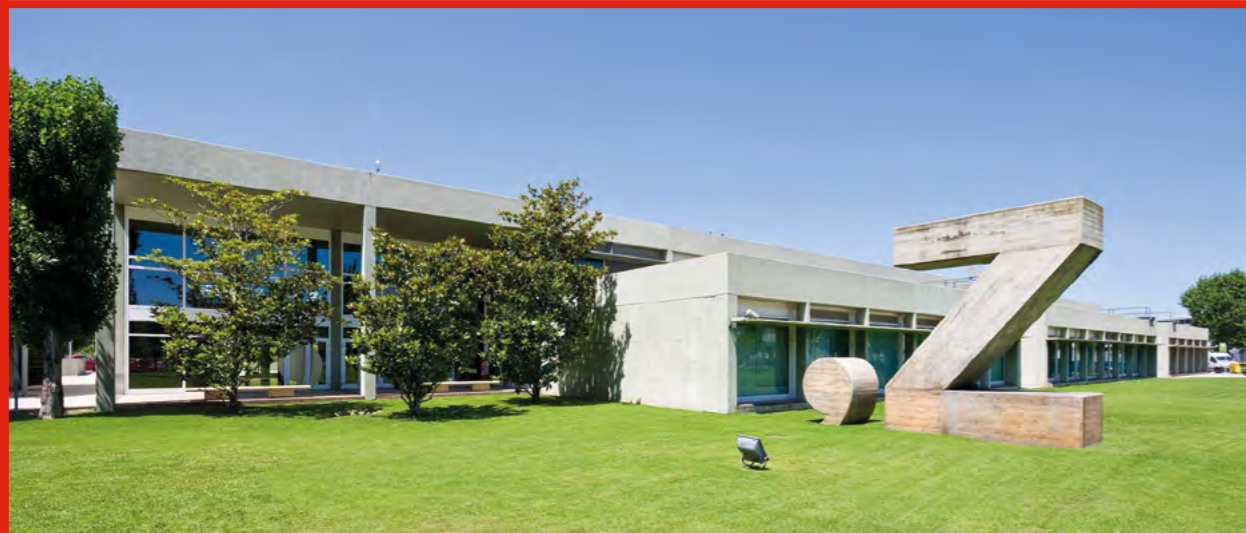
